COURSE SYLLABUS

Course Description:

Honors English IV is designed to prepare students for college-level work. This course will focus on close reading skills and literary interpretation, using a variety of literature. Students can expect to write several literary analysis papers to improve critical thinking skills. Each of these papers will focus on writing a strong, clear thesis and supporting it with effective textual evidence. Grammar and vocabulary will be regular aspects of the class to help strengthen writing skills. Students will be expected to give oral presentations. Students will also complete a senior project during first semester, which has a focus on preparing for college and on career development. This will be a major part of their semester grade.

Course Objectives:

Upon the successful completion of this course, students will be able to: successfully write fluid and cohesive papers, analyze and comprehend reading passages, debate topics, and research and present information to groups, write for college level assignments, and prepare a resume.
