COURSE SYLLABUS

Course Description:

Honors English II is designed to prepare students for college-level work. It is similar to English II but pushes the students to excel through a more in-depth study of the literature that is covered and through longer and more challenging writing assignments. The students will study at least 3 novels as well as a Shakespearean play. This is a writing intensive course which includes, but is not limited to, writing a research paper, literary analysis, and novel responses.

Prerequisite:

- 1) Application required
- 2) The student scores in the top 30% of their class on the Stanford Test
- 3) A 3.0 or better in other courses in the same subject, and
- 4) Teacher/administrative recommendation. (Level I course)

Note: This is a writing intensive course. Successful completion of this course meets one of the writing intense state requirements.

Course Objectives:

Upon the successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Understand elements of a novel, short stories, poems and plays including literary terms, vocabulary, etc.
- Identify parts of speech and use them in writing
- Understand and identify all of the components of a play and be able to write, perform and memorize specific parts
- Attempt to draw conclusions based on information found in text and other material
- Conduct a one-on-one interview and write about the experience
- Understand written information and respond using personal experiences; make connections
- Speak comfortably in front of a class while conveying opinions and information.
- Comprehend the research process and an effectively research a topic in order to produce a written document

We will be reading a variety of texts this year including, Julius Caesar, Catcher in the Rye, The Kite Runner and others to be added later. We will be doing a research unit along with a variety of grammar activities, a public speaking unit and practicing our literary skills. In this course there will be independent and group work, writing papers, taking assessments both online and in class and keeping an informal response journal.
