Course Syllabus 2011-2012

Course Description: This course will include a study of functions, limits, the techniques of finding derivatives and integrals as well as the applications of derivatives and integrals. The course is equivalent to the first semester of calculus at the college level.

Required class materials: 3-ring binder, loose-leaf paper, pencils, dividers, book cover, scientific calculator. (A graphing calculator would be a benefit to the student)

Text: Calculus Graphical, Numerical, Algebraic (Pearson Prentice Hall)

Grading: Daily homework, daily quizzes, chapter tests, binders/folders at the end of each chapter, attendance.
